



Dear parents and carers,

In our key stage 1 assembly and in further class discussions today, we will be revisiting the NSPCC's Underwear Rule. This is a rule that all children will be familiar with from previous years at Sandringham. During these discussions, we will aim to teach our children the following important safety skills in an age-appropriate manner. We will continue to use the PANTS acronym, which is like a green cross code for staying safe.

PANTS stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up; someone can help

We will introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that is fully age-appropriate. These include:

- "Appropriate" and "inappropriate" touching
- Your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable
- Who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried at home and at school
