Topic: Winter

This week we will be learning about one of our four seasons - Winter! Here are some activities that you can do at home. Have fun!

Personal, Social, Emotional/ Communication & Language/Literacy	Expressive Art & Design/ Physical Development
<p>Share lots of Rhymes, Songs and Stories.</p> <p>Winter Stories: 'Snowflakes' (Tapestry)</p> <p>Practise putting your coat, hat, scarf, boots and gloves on, on your own, when you go for a walk.</p> <p>Talk to a grown up and think of as many wintery words as you can, ask your grown up to write them on a piece of paper. Can you find some wintery coloured pens or pencils for them to write with then you could try copying some letters or words yourself. (winter/cold/freezing/ice/frost/glistening etc)</p> <p>How many words can you think of that begin with 'w' for winter? window, wall, wet, wish</p>	<p>Paint the background for a wintery picture using a brush (washing up brush, nail brush, bottle brush, toothbrush) and dab white paint to give a stippled effect.</p> <p>When it's dry add some wintery trees using the side of a piece of cardboard. Look at the trees outside to see how the branches grow. What else could you add to your winter picture? birds, snowmen.....</p> <p>Make some dough in wintry colours - blues, white, grey. Could you add some glitter to make it sparkle like the frost?</p> <p>Roll balls between the palms of your hands to make balls, can you flatten them with your hands and/or a roller? Can you make a snowman and find some things to use for arms (maybe matchsticks?), eyes, a nose, buttons etc.</p> <p>Sing some songs that you can move to which will keep you warm such as 'Wake up your muscles', 'Stand up, sit down', Hokey Cokey....</p>
Number	Understanding the World
<p>How many pairs of gloves/mittens can you find in your house? Collect them all together, mix them up and then put them back into pairs, matching the patterns, sizes etc.</p> <p>Make some snowballs using something like screwed up paper. Find a bin/bucket/pot, stand back away from the pot and count how many snowballs you get throw into the pot. Can you write that number on a piece of paper?</p> <p>Sing some number songs/rhymes: 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, once I caught..... 5 Little ducks..... 5 Currant buns in the bakers shop</p>	<p>Can you find any pictures/toys/books with animals from colder climates? Talk to someone about them, what are they called, where do they live, what do they eat etc</p> <p>Ask a grown up to help you look on an ipad/computer for some pictures/information about cold, snowy, icy places and people/animals that live there. Could you print some pictures and cut them out to make a collage, picture or book of your own?</p>
