## Home Learning Activities

Topic: Traditional Tales - Red Riding Hood w/c 1.2.21



### Personal, Social, Emotional/ Communication & Language/Literacy

Share lots of Rhymes, Songs and Stories.

Traditional Tales;

'Little Red Riding Hood' (Tapestry)

Read the story 'Red Riding Hood' and talk about the characters and setting. Join in with the repeated and rhyming phrases - "Oh Grandma, what big eyes you have!" - "All the better to see you with my dear!" .....etc Try using lots of expression in your voice.

Do some role play of the story.

Sing the 'n', 'i', 'p' songs (Tapestry) and practise forming them with your finger/pencil/pen.



### Expressive Art & Design/ Physical Development

Make a puppet of Red Riding Hood and/or the wolf. (Tapestry). Cut out the shapes and tape/glue them together. Draw on a face. Could you add wool for hair, googly eyes, red fabric on her cape, something soft for hair on the wolf? Attach a stick to the back to make a rod puppet.

Print some trees to make the woods, add Grandma and Red Riding Hoods cottages. Could you cut out/draw a wolf and a RRH for your picture. Make different paths through the woods to Grandma's cottage.



### Number/Maths

Number rhymes, songs and stories:

Five Cheeky Monkeys, Five Little Ducks (Tapestry), Five little aliens in a Flying saucer

Talk about the names of shapes - square, rectangle, triangle, circle..... Go on a shape hunt around your house, how many circles, squares, etc can you find, what are they? (circle- sponge, rectangle - window etc)

Make sandwiches/ cakes for your lunch and cut them into squares, triangles, rectangles, circles.



### Understanding the World

Ask a grown up to help you to find out about real wolves. Look in some books, print some pictures and cut them out. Find out where wolves live (Google 'youtube wolves preschool' for some videos)

Look at some pictures of your grandma/Grandma's house and talk about what her house is like, where it is etc.

Pack a pretend (or real!) picnic in a basket/bag and pretend to go through the woods to your Grandma's house and pretend to have a picnic with her!
