Topic: Bubbles and Rainbows

We are really pleased that our new format for learning is helping structure you and your child's day. The activities below reflect what we would be learning about at this point in the year at school. Remember though - you don't have to do it all; you can adapt it however you like and most importantly have fun and send us pictures of what you do! We know everyone has different circumstances at home and you need to make the home learning work for your family. Make time each day for some physical activity, for reading together or independently and some play or relaxing time. Encourage your child to include an act of kindness; tidy toys, helping to lay the table, helping unload the dishwasher, reading a story to a younger sibling etc.

DAY	DAILY ACTIVITIES
Monday	<p>Phonics: Have a selection of sounds written on pieces of paper. Spread them out across the floor and make 3-4 letter words by jumping from sound to sound.... c-a-t = cat / f-r-o-g = frog</p> <p>Maths: Recap your numbers from 0-20. Shuffle up number cards and place the numbers in order. Can you remember which numbers are teen numbers? You could try pegging them on your own washing line to make a number line! Play a number game/puzzle if you have one.</p> <p>Literacy: Learn the Sing a Rainbow song (link below) and practise the order of each of the colours. Can you find objects from around your house that are one of each of these colours? Order them like a rainbow.</p> <p>Topic: Have a bubbly bath tonight before bed! Can you make yourself bubble hair or a bubble beard? Look closely and have fun exploring lots of bubbles in your bath.</p>
Tuesday	<p>Phonics: Watch "Mr Thorne Does Phonics" - recapping the digraph ur (link below).</p> <p>Maths: Make a dry pasta necklace. Make a repeating pattern if you can.</p> <p>Literacy: Read The Bubble Mystery (link below)</p> <p>Topic: Make your own bubble mixture using washing up liquid and water. Blow bubbles to chase around the garden. Add some paint/food colouring to make a bubble picture.</p>
Wednesday	<p>Phonics: Recap ar with Mr Thorne (link below) and then play "Picnic on Pluto" on Phonics Play with ar words (link below)</p> <p>Maths: Draw 3 lollipops on a piece of paper. Choose 3 colours. Alternate each lollipop to ensure they are all different. This is problem solving and is called 'finding all possibilities'.</p> <p>Literacy: Watch The Rainbow Fish story (link below). Talk about sharing. Draw your own scale. Write a message to someone special and add sparkle and glitter where possible!</p> <p>Topic: Research Kandinsky's circles and recreate this art work using lots of bright colours.</p>
Thursday	<p>Phonics: Introduce the <u>trigraph</u> air with Mr Thorne (link below) and then ask a grown up to write the following list of words on cue cards: hair, fair, pair, chair, stairs, gair, mair, trair, mairt, dairm. Sort them into two piles... real words and nonsense words.</p> <p>Maths: Have some bubble blowing mixture ready. Make a prediction of how many bubbles you can blow/pop each time. Was your estimate near? Was it realistic?</p> <p>Literacy: Write a list of the tricky words we have been practising, in rainbow colours. Ask a grown up to test you as a spelling list. Can you remember how to spell to, no, go, the, he, she, was, you, my, they.</p> <p>Topic: Create a rainbow picture using an unusual or new media. If you have already drawn, coloured or painted one, try and use something different like chalk, collage, pom poms etc.</p>

Friday	<p>Phonics: Introduce the <u>trigraph ear</u> with Mr Thorne (link below) and then watch “Letter Teams” with the Alphablocks to recap air/ear (link below)</p> <p>Maths: Play an online Maths game on Top Marks to practise addition 0-20 (link below)</p> <p>Literacy: Model reading words with two syllables - explain that sometimes longer words seem tricky at first but if we break them down, it is easier... tonight = to-night, chicken = chick-en, rooftop = roof-top, farmyard = farm-yard, market = mar-ket, lightning = light-ning, bedroom = bed-room</p>
