Topic Theme: The Three Little Pigs

Described below are some suggested activities for home learning that we hope will structure you and your child's day. The activities are related to our topic and reflect what we would be learning about at this point in the year in Reception. Please remember this structure must be flexible and accommodate your child's needs and interests – feel free to adapt it however you like and most importantly have fun and send us pictures of what you do! We know everyone has different circumstances at home and you need to make the home learning work for your family. Remember each day to allocate time to play, for reading, physical activity etc. Remember to also include an act of kindness; tidy your toys, help lay the table, help unload the dishwasher, read a story to a younger sibling etc.

DAY	DAILY ACTIVITIES
Monday	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Miss Randles' video on Tapestry introducing digraphs.</p> <p>Maths: Sing these familiar nursery rhymes... Five Little Speckled Frogs, Five Currant Buns and Five Little Men (links to each below) to introduce the concept of subtraction. Talk about how in each verse of the song the quantity of frogs, buns and men become less. Use numbers to also show 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 also becoming less.</p> <p>Literacy: Watch Miss Hardy-Trodd's story of the 3 Little Pigs on Tapestry.</p> <p>Circle Time: Talk about why the wolf might have wanted to blow down the pigs' houses. Was he being bad? Did he want to be their friend? How could the wolf have asked to be a friend? Talk about what makes a good friend. Consider connecting with a friend virtually this week.</p> <p>Topic: Use construction materials (i.e. lego, duplo, stickle bricks, junk modelling) to build your own house. Is it strong enough to not be blown down?!</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time.</p>
Tuesday	<p>Welcome: Miss Randles will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry.</p> <p>Phonics: Watch "Mr Thorne Does Phonics" on YouTube (link below) to introduce today's digraph ch. There is also the Jolly Phonics song/action link below. Can you think of any other words that start with ch? Have a go at writing or making the following words - underline the 'ch' in each of them: chip, chin, chop, chick, bench, punch. NB Parents: please emphasise ch is different to t... <i>t-rain</i> and <i>ch-ain</i>.</p> <p>Maths: Have a running race with members of your family. Award 1st, 2nd and 3rd place to each person who takes part. Discuss the terminology of first, second and third with a grown up and relate it to every day activities... i.e. <i>I was first to wake up, my birthday is on the third of May</i> etc.</p> <p>Literacy: Write a list of words that rhyme with "pig". You can record your list in any way you like; with paint, on paper, on a laptop etc.</p> <p>Science: Find a variety of materials from around your house and explore which is the easiest to blow across the room. Use a drinks straw to help you. You could try paper, tissue, brick, sticks etc.</p> <p>Topic: Create your own "Wanted Poster" for the Big Bad Wolf. Describe him in pictures and words and use colouring pens/pencils to ensure it is bright and colourful.</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time.</p>
Wednesday	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry</p> <p>Phonics: Watch "Mr Thorne Does Phonics" on YouTube (link below) to introduce today's digraph sh. There is also the Jolly Phonics song/action link below. Can you think of any other words that start with sh? Have a go at writing or making the following words - underline the 'sh' in each of them: shop, shin, shed, fish, cash, brush, finish.</p> <p>Maths: Watch Miss Hardy-Trodd's video on Tapestry for today's subtraction challenge.</p>

	<p>Literacy: Draw a story map to show the story journey (see example below). Show the movements of the 3 pigs and colour the houses in the right colour in according to what material it was made out of. Use lines/arrows to show the journey of the pigs and wolf.</p> <p>PE: Can you practise the different ways of jumping... star jumps, pencil jumps, frog jumps. How many can you do in 1 minute? Challenge yourself to jump safely off an object remembering our gymnastic jump technique.</p> <p>Topic: Play "What's the Time Mr Wolf?" outside as part of today's physical activity. See link below to how to play.</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time.</p>
Thursday	<p>Welcome: Miss Randles will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry</p> <p>Phonics: Watch Miss Randles' video on Tapestry to introduce today's digraph th/th</p> <p>Maths: Play the "Subtraction to 10" game using the link below.</p> <p>Literacy: Recap the 3 Little Pigs story to a member of your family.</p> <p>Art: Draw or colour in a picture of your choice. Remember to keep inside the lines and change your colours according to what you're colouring in.</p> <p>Topic: Make a house/den for you to play in this afternoon. Make sure it will stay standing up in case your grown up tries to blow it down!</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time.</p>
Friday	<p>Welcome: Miss Hardy-Trodd will welcome the children to today's learning via Tapestry</p> <p>Phonics: Recap the tricky words we have been learning at school using the Tricky Words Song (link below). Play Tricky Word Bingo using these 10 words as part of the game (I, to, no, go, the, he, she, my, me, was). See pictures below for instructions on how to set up.</p> <p>Maths: Record the answers to the following subtraction number sentences using your home learning book or paper and objects to support your practical working out: $5 - 2 =$ $4 - 3 =$ $6 - 4 =$ $8 - 1 =$ $10 - 7 =$</p> <p>Literacy: Listen to an alternative version to this week's story... The 3 Little Wolves and The Big Bad Pig (see link below).</p> <p>Music: Use every day objects and utensils from around your house to make your own music... pots, pans, sticks etc. Can you stop and start when a grown up instructs you to.</p> <p>Story: See Tapestry for today's story time.</p>

Activity Examples...

Tricky Word Bingo:



1. Ask your child to draw a cross front top to bottom/left to right on their board/paper (pic 1)
2. List the 10 tricky words somewhere for your child to see
3. Ask them to choose just 4 and write one in each box on their board/paper (pic 2)
4. As the teacher, call out randomly the tricky words, one at a time
